- **Job Agreement/Contract**: We help facilitate a work agreement that includes pay, duties, and other important terms.

How to Become a Nanny with KBC Childcare

What Qualifications Do You Need?

- Professional Experience Must have prior full-time nanny experience or similar professional childcare experience.
- **J** Background & Driving Record Must pass a background check and have a clean driving record.
- Age Requirement Must be 21+ (unless applying for a datenight sitter role).
- Long-Term Commitment Should be looking for a longterm position (1-5+ years).
- Reliability & Responsiveness Must be timely in submitting documents and responsive in communication with our team.
- Professionalism Must attend all confirmed meetings and interviews in order to move forward in the process.
- Strong References Must have 3-4 strong childcare references that can speak to your experience and reliability. We never call them until we notify you and this would be after the zoom interview with our recruiter.



What is a Professional Nanny?

Many caregivers wonder whether their experience qualifies them as a professional nanny. The truth is, **you don't have to have worked with an agency to be considered a professional!** If you have worked with children in a dedicated role, your experience may qualify.

Babysitter vs. Nanny

A **babysitter** provides short-term or occasional care, usually on an as-needed basis. Babysitters are not typically responsible for household tasks, child development, or structured care routines.

A **nanny** is a dedicated childcare professional who provides consistent, long-term care. Nannies take on

a more structured role, often including:

- ✓ Creating and following daily routines
- ✓ Engaging in educational activities and developmental play
- ✓ Meal preparation and light household duties related to the child
- ✓ Assisting with milestones such as potty training or early learning
- ✓ Communicating with parents about the child's progress and needs

What Counts as Professional Nanny or Childcare Experience?

Even if you haven't worked as a nanny through an agency, your previous **childcare experience may count!** You may be considered a professional nanny if you have worked in:

- **▼** Full-time or part-time nanny positions
- (even if found independently)
- Live-in or overnight nanny care
- 🔽 Newborn or infant care (Newborn Care Specialist, night nanny, etc.)
- Daycares or early childhood education settings
- Schools or teaching roles
- (teacher, assistant, paraeducator, tutor, etc.)
- Camps, after-school programs, or youth mentoring
- Specialized childcare roles (such as working with children with disabilities or unique needs)

What Does Not Count as Professional Nanny Experience?

- Caring for family members alone does not count as professional experience. While personal experience with children is valuable, professional nannying requires paid experience with non-relatives.
- Norking for siblings or other relatives is not enough to qualify. However, if you have paid experience working with non-family members in addition to family care, we may be able to count it as part of your overall experience.

Step-by-Step Hiring Process

- 1. Apply via Website: Submit your application through our website or Indeed.
- 2. Log In to Engine Hire:
 - You will receive an email with a link to create your Engine Hire profile.
 - Use your email address as your username and password for the initial login. You can create a new password at this stage.
 - Follow the instructions in the email to complete your profile.
- 3. Recruiter Interview (Zoom):
 - After your profile is completed and approved, we will schedule a Zoom interview with one of our recruiters. This interview is to determine if you are qualified and a good fit for the available positions. Please be on the Zoom link at the time you schedule and in a quiet area, ready to proceed with the interview.
 - If you need to reschedule, email contact@kbc-childcare.com or reach out to your recruiter as soon as possible. If you miss your scheduled interview without notifying us, you will have one more opportunity to rebook. If you no-show a second time, we will not be able to move forward with your application.
- 4. **Submit Documentation:** After the Zoom interview, you will be asked to submit your ID, references, and any other relevant certifications through Engine Hire. Be sure to upload these documents as soon as possible.
- Reference Check: We will contact your references and confirm your childcare experience. If we have any questions, we will reach out to you directly.
- 6. Complete Your Profile:
 - Make sure your Engine Hire account is fully complete, including:
 - ID Collected
 - References Collected
 - Certifications Collected
 - All Documentation Received Ensure all the required documentation has been submitted.
 - Profile Picture Updated:
 - The photo should be a neat, clear headshot that is kid-appropriate.
 - The photo should not contain cleavage, graphic shirts, facial piercings, filters, or inappropriate angles.
 - The photo should be a straight-on headshot that looks clean, friendly, and professional.
 - This photo is never shared or posted until you choose which family to apply to. The family will see the photo once you decide to apply to them.
- 7. **Family Match:** We will share your completed profile with a family that we believe fits your skills and preferences.
- 8. Interview with the Family:
 - The family interview will be conducted via video call (FaceTime, Google Meet, or Zoom) based on the family's preference, unless they request a regular phone call.
 - Be sure to show up on time and be ready at the agreed time for the interview.
 - Please ensure your camera and microphone are working if it's a video call.
- In-Person Meet & Greet: If the interview goes well, we will arrange an in-person meet
 greet with the family to finalize the decision.
- 10. **Trial Period:** If all goes well during the meet & greet, we'll set up a paid trial period so you can work with the family and assess if it's a good fit for both sides. This is typically 1-5 days and is paid.
- **You're Hired!:** If the trial is successful, you'll be officially hired, and we'll help finalize the work agreement with the family to ensure everything is clear and agreed upon.
